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**ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:** A minimum cumulative GPA of at least 2.50, completion of the prerequisite courses detailed below and proof of RN licensure. Three letters of reference, official transcripts, and a resume are required in addition to the application.

When calculating GPA, all non-vocational and non-remedial courses from all colleges and universities attended are considered. Except for Intermediate Algebra, remedial courses are not factored into the GPA. When a course is repeated, both the original and the new grade are factored into the GPA. Except for ADN courses, courses that do not transfer to KU are not factored into the GPA.

**APPLICATION DEADLINE:** **November 1** for spring semester; **April 1** for summer semester; **July 1** for fall semester.

**DEGREE REQUIREMENTS:** The BSN consists of 120 credits, 60 of which are primarily liberal arts and sciences prerequisite courses and 60 of which are nursing major courses. Credit for the nursing major courses is earned through a combination of portfolio examination of ADN courses and KU BSN courses. The list below details the 60 credits of prerequisite courses.

Courses with grades of "D" or "F" will not be counted towards the required hours. No Pass/Fail courses will be accepted.
