



Kansas Locum Tenens

Resident Physicians and Fellows Provide Temporary Medical Coverage to Kansas Communities in Need.



To be eligible to provide Kansas Locum Tenens (KLT) primary care coverage, Kansas resident physicians and fellows must:

- ✓ Complete one year of residency
- ✓ Pass Step 3
- ✓ Get Program Director approval

Most KLT coverages are ER call and occur during weekends and holidays.



Complete the online KLT Provider Form at <https://bit.ly/KLTinKS> and submit copies of required documents.

- Kansas Resident Active License or Kansas Medical License
- Medical Diploma
- DEA Certificate
- ATLS & Other Certifications
- Medical Professional Liability Insurance
- NPI Number
- CAQH (if available)



An email will be sent when each new KLT coverage opportunity is available with details including:

- Dates and Times
- Organization, Location, Travel Distance
- Pay Rates

Click the link to view all KLT opportunities and select the coverages you want. Opportunities are first-come, first-served.



Once identified as the KLT Provider, two electronic forms will be initiated for digital signatures (*electronically via DocuSign*).

1. Service Order Form
 - KLT coordinator → **KLT provider** → Residency Director → Organization/Client
2. Request to Participate Form
 - KLT coordinator → **KLT provider** → Residency Director → WCGME/GME → Dean

Once all documents are signed, all parties will receive a final copy. KLT Provider will be notified if additional information is required.



Provide KLT coverage during the dates and times agreed to in the Service Order Form.

Offsite accommodations are required and provided by the Organization. KLT Provider will be sent a KLT invoice (*electronically via DocuSign*) to fill in hours, travel, etc. after the coverage is complete. The KLT invoice will route to the Organization for approvals and payment process.



Payment will be mailed directly to the KLT provider within two weeks.

Once the check is received, send a copy by text to 316.290.9424 or email klt@kumc.edu to the KLT Coordinator to verify payment.

Who is eligible to provide KLT coverage? *Kansas Resident Physicians and Fellows in approved programs.*

What is a typical KLT coverage? *KLT coverages are for Primary Care. Most are ER call and occur over weekends and holidays.*

Where are the coverages located? *In rural and underserved communities across Kansas.*

Is there assistance to help with Medical Professional Liability Insurance? *Yes! KLT offers up to \$1400 for insurance reimbursement for resident physicians and fellows who complete four coverages through KLT.*

How much do KLT Providers get paid? *Organizations set their own competitive rates and pay KLT Providers directly. An average weekend coverage pays \$4,800 – \$5,500!*

Why should I provide temporary coverage through KLT? *Help Kansas organizations provide continuation of care for their patients. Whether they are short-staffed, need to lessen call time, or give their providers time off to support a work/life balance, they appreciate the support of the KLT program and Providers.*
