ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS: To be eligible for admission, you must be admitted to the Johnson County Community College ADN program for the semester in which you are applying for admission to the KU School of Nursing. If you apply for this program at KU, but are not admitted to your community college's ADN program, you will not be considered for admission. You must begin the ADN and BSN nursing programs during the same semester.

Other requirements include a minimum 2.50 cumulative GPA, completion of the prerequisite courses detailed below, a professional resume, and three letters of reference in addition to the online application. Admission is competitive; applicants are not guaranteed admission.

When calculating GPA, all non-vocational and non-remedial courses from all colleges and universities attended are considered. Except for Intermediate Algebra, remedial courses are not factored into the GPA. When a course is repeated, both the original and the new grade are factored into the GPA. Courses that do not transfer are not factored into the GPA.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: The KU application deadline is July 1st for fall of the same year. Admission decisions are made as applications are received. Applicants are strongly encouraged to apply early.

LIBERAL ARTS REQUIREMENTS: Credit for the BSN is earned through a combination of liberal arts prerequisite courses, portfolio examination of ADN courses and KU BSN courses. The list below details the 62 credit hours of liberal arts courses required prior to matriculation into the Partnership program.

Courses with grades of "D" or "F" will not be counted towards the degree. No Pass/Fail courses will be accepted.

ADDITIONAL ELECTIVES NECESSARY TO MEET 62 CREDIT MINIMUM (4 credits)
Students must complete two humanities courses (one from the humanities list and an additional course). If the global awareness elective is not also listed by JCCC as a humanities course, then the general elective course must be a humanities course. Otherwise, electives can be chosen according to your interests or needs. Examples are foreign language, philosophy, literature, creative writing, history, speech, physics, mathematics, political science, biological sciences, and economics.
