ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS: To be eligible for admission, you must be admitted to the Neosho County Community College ADN program for the semester in which you are applying for admission to the KU School of Nursing. If you apply for this program at KU, but are not admitted to NCCC's ADN program, you will not be considered for admission. **You must begin the ADN and BSN nursing programs during the same semester.**

In addition to the online application, other requirements include a minimum cumulative GPA of at least 2.50, three reference letters, a professional resume, and completion of the prerequisite courses detailed below. Admission is competitive; applicants are not guaranteed admission.

When calculating GPA, all non-vocational and non-remedial courses from all colleges and universities attended are considered. Except for Intermediate Algebra, remedial courses are not factored into the GPA. When a course is repeated, both the original and the new grade are factored into the GPA. Except for ADN courses, courses that do not transfer to KU are not factored into the GPA.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: The KU application deadline is July 1st for fall of the same year (for Chanute campus), and December 1st for spring of the following year (for Ottawa campus). Admission decisions are made as applications are received. Applicants are strongly encouraged to apply early.

LIBERAL ARTS REQUIREMENTS: Courses with grades of "D" or "F" and pass/fail or credit/no credit courses are not accepted.
